

SUBJECT: Designation Moratorium - FCI Danbury Satellite
Prison Camp (SPC)

Effective the date of this memorandum, a 60-day moratorium on designations and redesignations is being placed on the SCP at FCI Danbury. Due to the severe overcrowding at SCP Danbury, the moratorium is necessary in order to alleviate some of the population pressures. During this 60-day period, no inmates will be designated or redesignated to SCP Danbury.
